Pastor's Corner



I write from under an already overloaded-withsnow home's roof with the prospect of still more snow to come!

We are entering into the Lenten-Easter season of the church's year. The word LENT comes from

an Old English word "lencten" which means "springtime". That is encouraging! The winter burdens are going to be lifted—eventually. The origin of the word EASTER is not so clear. One thought is that the word came from Old English "Oestre", an Anglo-Saxon pagan goddess whose festival was at this time of year. Also, the word could be derived from the German word *Ostern*, meaning Easter, the day of the Resurrection.

Lent is the season of preparation for celebrating the resurrection of Jesus. Originally it was a time for preparation for Baptism during the Easter Vigil, the evening before Easter. During this preparation would be a time of discovery of what it meant to join through the rite of Baptism for this community following Jesus and his teaching. Each Sunday is a little Easter, a weekly recollection of the resurrection of Jesus. Following the Sunday worship, here in Deering Community Church, we will be preparing to greet the Resurrection with a weekly time of sharing using the theme "Saving Jesus". Up in the parlor, we will have an opportunity to see a short video presentation by a number of persons who have specialized their studies on various aspects of the life and message of Jesus. Join with us as we prepare to acknowledge and celebrate the festival of Jesus' resurrection.

Elsewhere in this newsletter you will find information about a change in our worship for Palm Sunday, March 29. At the invitation of Smith Memorial Church, our choir and their choir will join

together for a presentation of a worship cantata concerning the activities of Jesus and his disciples during the week leading up to the Crucifixion and Resurrection. This will take place during worship at Smith Memorial, March 29 at 10:30 am. Therefore we will be having joint worship with the people of Smith Memorial at the Hillsboro church with the leadership of Pastor Eric Johnson and myself. There will be no Palm Sunday worship at Deering Church on that date. This is not a decision that has been made lightly. The Deacons have discussed it and it was presented to the Church Council

meeting February 10. It was decided by the Council to participate in this joint worship in Hillsboro. We hope the members and friends of Deering Community Church will support and participate in this co-operative worship experience.

There will be Easter sunrise worship with other Christian communities in the Deering-Hillsboro area in our usual hilltop field in Hillsboro at 6:30 AM, April 5. This will be followed by our church's Celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus in worship at 10:00 AM in Deering Community Church.

Moderator's Desk

Just a few weeks ago, we had our Annual Meeting, and I found it remarkable on many fronts. Sure, it went smoothly as representatives of the various boards and committees read their reports. Even the financials, as presented by Suzanne and Stuart were discussed with little objection or dissent. We added some dollars to the budget to fund the Search Committee, and we added some cash to the music program, but everyone was very agreeable to all that was said. But the last half hour was where I found the excitement. We honored Jim Carpenter for his 20+ years as a deacon, a remarkable feat, and one that has had a tremendous impact on the life of the Deering Community Church. We thanked him as best we could, honoring him with the title of 'Deacon Emeritus', a distinction that required us to make an addition to the bylaws. Again we thank you Jim for your many years of service.

Honoring him as we did, the thought came to mind that we have many Jim Carpenters in our membership. People who keep the church running smoothly month after month, year after year. Looking at the slate of committee members in the Nominating Committee report, it's clear that we have more positions to fill than those that can reasonably fill them. So the number of people who serve our church family is small, but those people continue to serve us all faithfully. We are fortunate, and give thanks.

At the end of the meeting, when people were starting to get itchy to head home, I called for additional new business. It was remarkable that so many people had something to say. It was clear that many wanted to have a discussion on the direction the church should head. Ideas were thrown out on how to attract new people to our church, and activities that we should pursue. In those somewhat chaotic moments, it was clear that we needed to provide an additional forum, to gather again to discuss these issues. Now that was exciting! Perhaps we should open it up to the community, offering a means for people to express what the wider community is looking for, and how they might like to get involved. With the Deering Church the only church in town, it would seem to me that there are people out there who would want to join us in our work. People with their own energy and creative ideas on how to serve the local and wider community. Let's have that forum, and invite them to join us.

So last week we cancelled church again due to the weather. The forecasters had predicted yet another foot of snow, and the driving was to be treacherous. It made sense for us to announce the cancellation the Saturday afternoon before the storm. An email went out to the congregation, and Channel 9 was notified to add us to their long list of cancellations. It's funny, I recall years ago when our then-minister Rev. Stan Keach used to say, "I don't care if I have to get there on skis, we will hold a church service!". That hearty New England-style anecdote is fun to say, but times are certainly different now. I'm told that some schools are having so many closings due to weather that they may hold classes until June 29th! Current thinking is that it's better to be safe than sorry, and while I do hesitate to make the call and actually close church for a Sunday, I do agree.

Workdays, March 7, April 4

Budget Report, Treasurer

At the annual meeting of the church held in January, the budget presented was approved with a few minor additions. \$250.00 was added for possible search committee expenses and \$250.00 was added to the music accompanist line to reflect actual expenses for 2014. The addition was covered by

adding \$500.00 to the carryover income line which reflects the actual carryover from 2014 which was larger than expected.

As of the middle of February, there are no unusual expenses to report.

Financial Secretary's Report

This church, like all UCC congregations, is self-determining and self-supporting. We do not receive any financial support from state or national UCC boards. Our annual pledge drive is an indication of the amount of support our church family is willing to promise to the Deering Community Church. This pledged amount is the primary basis for budget planning, and to this amount is added income from the endowment, fund raising (Fair) and miscellaneous other small amounts.

The annual pledge drive, which usually has occurred in November, this year did not happen until just before the Annual Meeting on January 25th. This meant that the proposed budget for 2015 had to be prepared without knowing how much support the congregation would be pledging. Last year you promised to support the mission of the church with \$42,766.00, so the amount of \$42,000.00 was placed in the budget for 2015, and the budget was adopted at the Annual Meeting. This could really be called a "Faith" budget since people's circumstances change

over the year, and, in fact, the makeup of the congregation also changes so the pledged amount was really an unknown.

But this church family can be counted on, and at this writing we have received pledges totaling \$44,600.00, which is not only more than the amount in the 2015 budget, but is also more than was pledged in 2014.

If you may be someone who has not yet pledged, your promise of support can be added anytime to this total. And, if you have pledged, and your circumstances change, your pledge can be easily adjusted anytime. There are also members and friends of the church who choose not to pledge, but give as able, many times for special projects/events. All of this creates a picture of a caring supportive church community, which is important as we move forward with our search for a settled pastor. This small, energetic, caring congregation should be proud of all it accomplishes.

"PSC" Committee

The journey of searching for a new Pastor began when we were first notified of Pastor Barbara Luckett-Currie's intention of retiring in October, 2013. An Interim Pastor Search Committee then worked together to bring Pastor Leonard Zecchini to the Deering Community Church. He has been, and will continue to guide us through this search for our next Pastor.

Throughout the Summer and Fall of 2014, people were asked to step forward if they were interested in being on the Pastor Search Committee. The Pastor Search Committee, or "PSC", as we will generally be referred as, had officially begun on January 8, 2015. Our Church Moderator, Peter Cram, held the first meeting, with guidance and support from Pastor Leonard Zecchini. Peter told us that we would be working with Gary Shulte, the UCC Conference Minister assigned to support us through this process.

As duly elected Chairperson of the committee, I had asked Peter if we might be able to open up the committee to a couple more people so that we could better represent Church Committees and the whole Congregation. In a Special Meeting held after Church on February 1, 2015, the Congregation elected Stuart Huggard and David Bell to join the PSC. Now our robust committee was ready and anxious to get underway. The committee will be meeting regularly on Monday nights, once we get started with Gary Shulte.

However, bad weather and other commitments have both made it difficult for our committee to yet meet with UCC Conference Minister, Gary Shulte. He will be providing materials and resources as well as an outline of steps in the search process as support to the PSC. Until we meet with him, and I have more information to provide the congregation, I can share what Peter told us at the first PSC meeting.

This will be a lengthy journey, possibly up to two years. The process had already begun with procuring Pastor Leonard. There would be a number of steps on this journey. In our first meeting, the committee had to elect people to fill various positions. We were informed that our committee would be bound to strict confidentiality with regards to names and other personal matters. Peter will likely not be attending all PSC meetings, but will support us as a non-voting member. Thank you for your support, Peter!

As part of the Pastoral Search, a big part of this process will be in creating the Deering Community Church Profile. Before we can determine what to look for, and possibly what we will want in our next Pastor, we need to discover and/or describe who we are as a Church: where we want to go and do and be in the future. This will become our Church Profile. While we will be getting materials and support from the UCC Conference as to 'how to' garner information for our Church Profile, it will ultimately be up to our Pastor Search Committee to decide what process or procedure might work best for the Deering Community Church. Rest assured, your combined in-put will be sought, and considered vital for the Church Profile which will also help represent your voices in guiding the PSC in the search for our new Pastor.

I will do my best to keep everyone informed of the status of the process and progress of the PSC, through the Newsletter, during announcements in Church, possible Church Bulletin inserts, etc.

So stay tuned! And please keep the Pastoral Search Committee in your prayers, so that we may best represent each of you, the Deering Community Church, and have guidance through the Blessed Spirit, along our journey.
